

ORDINANCE NO. 1

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE PROCEDURES AND FORMS TO BE USED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL AND MAYOR OF THE TOWN OF GREENWOOD, FLORIDA, FOR THE ENACTMENT OF ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GREENWOOD, FLORIDA, That:

Section 1. Any proposed ordinance or resolution may be introduced in written or printed form at any regular or special meeting of the Town Council and shall be read in full. Such proposed ordinance may be discussed, but further action thereupon shall be deferred until the next regular or special meeting, at which time it may be read a second time by title only, and passed upon second reading by two (2) affirmative votes. The enacting clause of all ordinances shall be "BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GREENWOOD, FLORIDA". Such proposed resolution may be discussed and passed in the same meeting at which it was introduced. The enacting clause of all resolutions shall be "BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GREENWOOD, FLORIDA". All ordinances and resolutions shall become effective upon the date set forth therein, or upon the approval of such ordinances or resolutions by the Mayor, or in the event he shall disapprove the same, by a unanimous vote of the Town Council. Any proposed ordinance or resolution may be amended upon either reading. All ordinances and resolutions shall be copied verbatim in, or a certified copy thereof attached to the minute books of the Town Council. All ordinances shall be posted in at least three (3) public places in the Town of Greenwood, one of which shall be the office of the Town Clerk, for a period of at least one week after passage.
