

AN ACT to Amend Section 1 and Section 3 of Chapter 12779, Laws of Florida, Special Acts of 1927, Relating to the Territorial Limits of the Municipality of the Town of Greenwood in Jackson County, Florida; and Relating to the Salaries to be Paid to the Town Marshal and the Town Clerk of said Town of Greenwood; and Providing for a Referendum:

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF FLORIDA:

Section 1. That Section 1 of Chapter 12779, Laws of Florida, Special Acts of 1927, be amended to read:

"Section 1. A municipal corporation to be known as the Town of Greenwood is hereby created and established in Jackson County, Florida, and the territorial limits of said municipality shall be as follows:

Sections 31 and 32 of Township 6 North, Range 9 West; and Sections 5 and 6 of Township 5 North, Range 9 West."

Section 2. That Section 3 of Chapter 12779, Laws of Florida, relating to the salaries of the Town Marshal and the Town Clerk, be amended to read:

"Section 3. That the salaries of the Town Marshal and the Town Clerk shall be as fixed by the Town Council of the Town of Greenwood by Ordinance or Resolution of said Governing Body.

Section 3. All laws or parts of laws in conflict herewith are repealed.

Section 4. A special referendum election to vote on the question of adoption and approval of this Act shall be called by the Town Council of the Town of Greenwood within sixty (60) days after this Act becomes a law. At such election all qualified electors of the Town of Greenwood shall be entitled to vote on the question of the adoption of this Act. The Town Council shall prescribe the form of ballot to be used in said special referendum election.

Section 5. This Act shall take effect immediately upon its approval by the Governor, or upon its becoming a law without such approval, subject, however, to the referendum election herein provided for.
