## **TRASH FACILITY**

Until further notice, the roll off ramp at the Garbage Facility will be closed for repairs. At this time, yard trash and debris, such as limbs, leaves, branches, etc, are not being accepted at the Garbage Facility.

**Reminder-Rules and Policies:** The facility is open on Tuesdays and Saturdays from **7:30 am to 4:30 pm** for the disposal of household garbage. Please present your garbage card to the garbage attendant, if requested. If you have lost or misplaced your card, please contact Town Hall for a replacement.

## **HURRICANE MICHAEL UPDATES**

We know that everyone is still dealing with the recovery from Hurricane Michael. Jackson and Calhoun Counties have come together to form the non-profit North Florida Inland Recovery group. Everyone understands the importance of providing immediate relief when a major disaster occurs but long term recovery is necessary to sustain and rebuild our communities. Assistance is available for businesses, as well as individuals.

The **deadline** for debris to be placed by the roadside has been extended to **March 15, 2019**. Debris **MUST** be separated into piles to be eligible for pickup: (1) limbs/trees, and yard trash,

(2) building and/or construction materials (roofs, lumber, sheds etc.), and (3) household items (appliances, furniture etc.). Please be careful and do not pile debris under utility lines, on your water meter, or block access to driveways and mailboxes. The Town will be able to provide limited assistance for the transfer of debris to the right-of-way. Please call Town Hall for more information.

### SAFETY

Starting in March 2019, the town will begin mowing and weed eating along the right of ways throughout town. Please be cautious and courteous as you approach work crews.

### REMINDER

Water and garbage bills are mailed at the end of each month and are due by the 10<sup>th</sup> day of the following month. A 10% late fee will be applied on all overdue amounts if not paid by the 15<sup>th</sup>. **If the total bill, including late fees, is not paid by the 20<sup>th</sup> of the month your services will be turned-off/suspended after 9:00 a.m. on the 21<sup>st</sup>.**

If your water/garbage is turned-off/suspended, the entire bill including late charges and a \$40.00 reconnect fee must be paid in order to reactivate your account. If you have any questions regarding your billing please contact Town Hall as soon as possible.

### PET CORNER

Animals **must be confined at all times** for the safety and well-being of everyone in our town according to Town Ordinance No. 2008-04. This will prevent fines and/or removal of your animal by the Animal Control Officer. Please be mindful and courteous of your neighbors.

### WATER CONSERVATION

#### Keep Your Pool Covered When Not In Use

The average pool takes 22,000 gallons of water to fill, and if you don't cover it, hundreds of gallons of water per month can be lost due to evaporation.
