

**MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING

GREENWOOD, FLORIDA  
SEPTEMBER 8, 2020**

The Town Council of the Town of Greenwood, Florida met in a regular session at 6:30 p.m. on the 8<sup>TH</sup> day of September, 2020. The place, time, and date heretofore established for the holding of such meetings.

Mayor Suzanne NeSmith called the meeting to order.

Everyone in attendance stood for the Pledge of Allegiance to the American flag. Mayor NeSmith read the quote of the month.

The Clerk declared a quorum present.

Others in Attendance: Thomas Broxton, Russell Stillman, and Juan Moffitt

The first item on the agenda was the approval of the minutes for the July 20, 2020 Emergency Meeting, the August 11, 2020 Council Meeting, the August 20, 2020 Budget Workshop and the September 1, 2020 TRIM Meeting. A motion to approve the above listed minutes as presented was made by CM Ditty with a second by CM Vann. Vote called. Ditty – Yes. Vann – Yes Johnson - Yes. Motion was passed unanimously.

The next item on the agenda was the approval of the financials for August 2020. A motion to approve the financials for August 2020 as presented was made by CM Johnson with a second by CM Ditty. Vote called. Johnson - Yes. Ditty – Yes. Vann – Yes Motion was passed unanimously.

The next item on the agenda was Shandrell Poole regarding the trash facility. This item will be rescheduled for the October Council Meeting.

The next item on the agenda was a review of the current Code Enforcement letters/orders. Mayor NeSmith, Code Enforcement Officer, provided Council with a list indicating the current Code Enforcement issues she is actively working. CM Ditty inquired about the few on the past list. Mayor NeSmith stated those are still being worked, this is the new violations she has added. Mayor NeSmith also stated that the Town is in the process of getting quotes on clean-up on a few of the prior violations. She will advise Council of any changes.

Attorney Little stated there are no new legals to discuss.

TC Corder gave clerk notes. She requested Council's input on the issue of reconnect fees and contacting customers prior to shutoffs. The Town's current policy is that no courtesy or reminder calls are made. If we change policy and start calling then it puts the burden and liability on us if we cannot contact them based on our current customer contact information. Attorney Little agrees with TC Corder. After a brief discussion it was unanimously decided to leave policy as stands.

TC Corder advised Council that our TRIM Meeting will need to be changed due to timing constrictions based on the TRIM calendar. She will advise Council on the new Meeting date.

TC Corder read a thank you note from a customer to our Road Maintenance Department commending them on the job they are doing to keep Greenwood beautiful. We have shared this with the Road Maintenance crew and wholeheartedly agree. The temporary employment of Willie Godfrey, to help due to the loss of State inmates, will continue until we complete the current mowing cycle. He has been a great asset to the Town.

The new warehouse is almost ready for full occupancy.


